Car seats and Parking

Please can we remind you not to leave a child alone in any vehicle. There is no specific law against this. However, it is an offence to leave your child alone if it places them at risk. Heat stroke is the biggest danger, other risks include being trapped, setting the car in motion or being taken from the car. If you see a child left alone inside a car call 999 to get them out as quickly as possible.

Please ensure you have a car seat for your child. UK law states that children must use a child car seat until they're 12 years old or 135cm/4ft 5in tall, whichever comes first. However, safety experts recommend that you use a child car seat for all children under 150cm/4ft 11in. We would like to remind all parents when bringing their children by car to please be considerate when dropping off and picking up your child up from nursery. <u>Do not</u> park on pavements, park over driveways/dropped kerbs or on the white lines- doing so can make it very dangerous for pedestrians and other road users. Please do not park in Selwyn Court (the big white building next to the nursery) as this is private property, Thank you.

Please ensure that you have updated your hours for September 2022 with Becky as we have almost reached capacity for the next academic year. The nursery will be closed from the 1st August to the 12th August 2022.

We will be open again from the 15th August.
